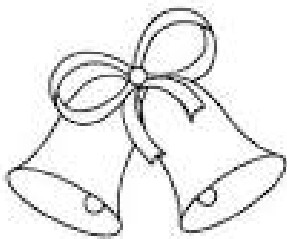
FOR YOUR HELP
