What is it you want?

Following an extensive period of ministry to the people, Jesus and his disciples finally need time to themselves, to rest, pray and reflect on their experiences; fostering their own relationship with God. But the crowds in today's Gospel have other ideas; they have seen miracles and want more, they are not satisfied.

Not much has changed in 2,000 years! Our relationship with God and His Church easily become one of supply and demand "We demand, you supply". God isn't some Divine 'vending machine' where we come to Mass, or say a prayer and He supplies what we want. Anyone who has this view is going to be disappointed. This 'vending machine' will only ever give us what we **need** ... His infinite, compassionate love, mercy and tenderness that guides us to our fulfilment in Him alone. The warning of the prophet Jeremiah remains for all involved in Pastoral Ministry: a reminder that the Church is called to be the vehicle of Salvation to the peoples; the servant of the Truth who invites and draws in; not a social gathering that is there to serve the whims of those who walk through the door, or the politics of the pastors.

We recently heard in the Gospel how Jesus could work no miracle in his home town because of "their lack of faith". They couldn't see who it was that stood before them, even with the signs he had given. They did not want to see beyond the external, beyond the material. For true and lasting fruit; for green and pleasant pastures we must enter into an intimate relationship with God. This intimacy was foremost in the mind of Jesus when he took his disciples into 'retreat'. Work has its place as does prayer and the two mutually nourish one another. This is why daily prayer at church or in the home is absolutely essential. Just like the disciples we need to take stock and in light of the Divine Truth given to us in Jesus, we need to realign ourselves with His will for us.

Fr. Jean Pierre DeCussade in his work "Abandonment to Divine Providence" wrote:

"It is certain that God always gives what is necessary to those souls who fear Him. The gifts He bestows on them are not always the most apparent to the senses, nor the most agreeable, nor the most sought after, but the most necessary and solid; all the more so, usually, in being less felt and more mortifying to self-love; for that which helps us most powerfully to live to God is what best enables us to die to self."

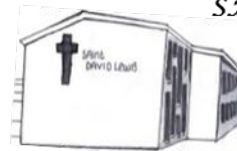
