The readings that have been presented to us over these last few weeks, as we have begun a new liturgical year, gives us the tools we need to live out our lives as disciples of the Lord. We are prompted afresh to take our baptismal calling seriously, to *"go, and make disciples of all the nations"*, not only in big and dramatic ways, but in the small ways that we live out our life: in our actions and in our words; the examples we set at home and in the workplace.

At the heart of our baptismal calling is our profound communion with the Lord, in that intimate relationship we cultivate and grow with Jesus. Living lives as disciples means nothing without this divine intimacy as its firm foundation. The psalmist speaks of that relationship with the Lord with such closeness as to be able to *"take refuge"* in the Lord; in other words to allow the Lord to be that place of protection and security, a place of comfort and consolation, especially during times of anxiety, fear, or persecution.

As we strive to live out afresh our unique baptismal callings, let the words of Our Lord to Jeremiah, at the end of our first reading, be a source of security for us: *"They will fight against you but shall not overcome you, for I am with you to deliver you – it is the Lord who speaks"*.
