“WHOSE CHILDREN ARE THEY ANYWAY?”

The Curriculum and Assessment (Wales) Bill currently before the Senedd will effectively remove the rights of parents as the first educators of their children. It will threaten the nature and purpose of Catholic schools as well as being an affront to devout Jews, Christians, Hindus, Sikhs and Muslims in Wales.

In the provisions concerning Human and Sex Education, the responsibility and privilege of parents to choose the right moment and language to discuss love and human sexuality with their children will be overridden by the imposition of a curriculum not in conformity with Christian teaching and that of many other faiths. The right of parents to remove their children from such classes will be removed.

The implication of this Bill places the right of the State before that of the parents of a child in such an important part of life. Should this ideologically driven Bill become law, it will remove the ancient freedoms and duties of parents in the education of their children. It would restrict freedom of conscience, freedom of expression, freedom of worship and conscientious objection. These are fundamental human rights which should be respected in a pluralistic society. They are not being upheld by this proposed legislation.

The assertion of power by Welsh Government in the lives of its citizens is not always malicious, but it cannot go unchallenged. The responses to the consultation on this Bill have been largely ignored. The First Minister of Wales and the Members of the Senedd need to be reminded very clearly that they were elected by us in order to represent us. We do not elect members of the Senedd to usurp our role as parents, grandparents and families. The rights and duties of parents are more significant and profound than party view and politics. The abuse of government power cannot go unchallenged. If we remain silent, there will be no appeal.

CORONAVIRUS UPDATE


FUNERALS – Please remember that attendance at funerals (both at the church and crematorium/graveside) is strictly by invitation only.

NHS TEST AND TRACE – St. Mary's is now registered as a check in location on the NHS Test and Trace app. You can download the App from the Apple App Store or GooglePlay.

PARISH HALL FACILITIES – remain CLOSED at this time.

BAPTISMS – the celebration of the Sacrament of Baptism remains suspended until safety concerns can be addressed adequately. However, in the event of an emergency the priests remain on hand via the emergency sick call number.

MORE STEWARDS REQUIRED: Our teams of stewards and cleaners have worked extremely hard over recent months. It is now clear that the COVID-19 restrictions are going to be in place for some time to come.
